55. CONFIRMATION OF MINUTES

On the proposition of Councillor John Bonham seconded by Councillor Ray Cribbin, it was agreed that the Minutes of the April meeting held on the 11th of May 2009 as circulated be adopted and signed.

56. CONFIRM DATE FOR ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING OF LAOIS COUNTY COUNCIL – 19TH JUNE 2009

The Members agreed that the Annual General Meeting of Laois County Council would take place on the 19th of June 2009 at 2.00 p.m.

57. DISPOSAL OF LAND UNDER SECTION 183 OF THE LOCAL GOVERNMENT ACT, 2001 IN RESPECT OF1.41 ACRES APPROXIMATELY AT PORTLOAISE ROAD, ABBEYLEIX

On the proposition of Councillor John Bonham seconded by Councillor John Joe Fennelly, the members unanimously agreed to the disposal of 1.41 acres approximately at Portlaoise Road, Abbeyleix for the sum of €1,656,000 and subject to certain conditions

58. APPROVAL OF OVERDRAFT ACCOMMODATION IN THE SUM OF €9,000,000 FOR THE HALF-YEAR ENDING 31/12/2009

On the proposition of Councillor Michael Lalor seconded by Councillor John Bonham, the members unanimously agreed to the approval of overdraft accommodation in the sum of $\leq 9,000,000$ for the half-year ending 31/12/2009.

Mr. Gerry Murphy, Head of Finance indicated that the overdraft facility has been increased from €6,000,000 to €9,000,000. Members expressed concern regarding the finances and the situation by the end of the current year, and in particular the areas of road maintenance and housing maintenance. Mr. Peter Carey, County Manager indicated that Laois County Council are operating in a very difficult economic environment and emphasised the importance of managing our budget prudently and that the priority will be to maintain frontline services. He stated that expenditure cutbacks were being implemented in the current year in an effort to stay within budget. He also said that income streams were under pressure and that the situation would be kept under review.

59. ANNUAL FINANCIAL STATEMENT 2008 – APPROVAL OF OVER-EXPENDITURE AND TRANSFER TO CAPITAL

The Members were circulated with a copy of the Annual Financial Statement for 2008 containing an Income and Expenditure Account Statement, Balance Sheet, Statement of Accounting Policies, Notes to the Accounts and Appendices. Details of additional expenditure incurred in 2008 under the various services and details of transfers from revenue to capital were also outlined in this document.

On the proposition of Councillor Paul Mitchell seconded by Councillor John D. Turley, the members unanimously agreed to the Annual Financial Statement 2008 and the approval of over-expenditure and transfer to capital.
