The Members were circulated with a copy of the revised Standing Orders for the Strategic Policy Committees and on the proposition of Councillor William Aird seconded by Councillor John Joe Fennelly, the revised Standing Orders were adopted, with the addition of the words 'save in exceptional circumstances' to the non-attendance clause.

184. PRESENTATION BY MR. COLM O' GORMAN, AMNESTY IRELAND

The Cathaoirleach, Councillor James Daly welcomed Mr. Colm O' Gorman, Amnesty Ireland to the Chamber who gave a briefing paper on Violence Against Women in Ireland. The Members complimented Mr. O' Gorman for his presentation and a lengthy discussion ensued during which Members expressed concern in relation to the significant increase of violence against women.

The County Manager indicated that there needs to be greater collaboration between the agencies in Laois and assured the Members of the willingness of Laois County Council to work with the agencies for a more strategic approach in this area.

185. PRIDE OF PLACE AWARDS

Councillor James Daly, Cathaoirleach announced the great success of Laois County Council in this year's All-Ireland Pride of Place Competition for which the awards ceremony was held in Newcastle, Co. Down. The Cathaoirleach welcomed the representatives from the Camross Community Group who were the overall winners, representatives from the Riverview Apartments, Portlaoise who received a runner-up prize and also representatives from Oisin Park & Donaghmore Workhouse who were also shortlisted in the competition.

Laois County Council also won the award for the best local authority. This award was presented to Laois County Council in recognition of the excellent relationship between the elected Members and officials of the Council and the communities we work with. This was clearly demonstrated to the judges, who particularly remarked on the number of Councillors and officials from Laois County Council who attended the judging days.

The County Manager paid tribute to all the organisations concerned and congratulated Mr. Declan Byrne, Director of Services and his staff who were involved and worked with all the community groups, Ms. Georgina Ireland, Mr. Dom Reddin & Ms. Alice Kirwan. He also thanked the elected Members for their support. The County Manager congratulated the winners and also the participants.

The Members of Laois County Council individually and collectively congratulated all the groups involved and paid tribute to the Community & Enterprise Section.

Mr. Ian McCormack, A/Director of Services & Mr. Dom Reddin, Community & Enteprise Development Officer acknowledged the support of the County Manager, the Cathaoirleach & all the elected Members throughout the year.

186. REPORT ON SERVICE INDICATORS

The Members were circulated with a report on the Service Indicators for Local Authorities 2008 which is a annual report published by the Department of the Environment, Heritage & Local Government in relation to service provision by the local authorities. The County Manager indicated that financial constraints will impact on performance in certain areas, however, Laois County Council will endeavour to meet high standards in 2010 with everyone working together and achieving the best use of our resources.

A lengthy discussion ensued regarding the response from the H.S.E in relation to St. Vincent's Hospital, Mountmellick and also in relation to a similar situation at Shaen Hospital. On the proposal of Councillor Pat Bowe, the Members unanimously agreed that a letter issue to the Minister for Health and also to the H.S.E. to seek clarification on the matter with a view to retaining the services at both these hospitals.

Councillor Jerry Lodge proposed that the three Dáil Deputies be requested to arrange a meeting with Professor Brendan Drumm in the H.S.E.

188. NOTICE OF MOTIONS

Notice of Motion No: 31/09

Councillor Brian Stanley proposed the following Notice of Motion:-

"That this Council put in place an Action Plan for drainage to prevent and alleviate flooding. This must include maintenance of gullies, grids and waterways which would prevent much of the flooding that has happened recently"

This motion was seconded by Councillor John Joe Fennelly

The Members were advised that the Council has systems and procedures in place to deal with flooding emergencies. In fact, the council's Major Emergency Plan has a specific Sub-Plan to deal with flooding. As a matter of course, the Council carries out regular maintenance of road gullies. Councillor Stanley indicated that the plan should identify the areas of concern and that the Members receive an outline of the plan and what the response procedures are.

Compliments were paid to area staff on action taken over the County during the recent floods. The County Manager also paid tribute to Laois County Council area staff and also the staff in the Fire Service and Civil Defence.

Notice of Motion No: 32/09

Councillor Jame Daly proposed the following Notice of Motion:-

"That Laois County Council advocate the provision of a refuge in the County, enabling victims of domestic violence to have a refuge in their own County, and request the County Manager to meet with the H.S.E. to pursue the matter"

This motion was seconded by Councillor Brian Stanely.

The Members were informed that Laois County Council refer victims of domestic violence to the Women's Refuge in Athlone & Kilkenny. If the victims are unable to return to their homes, Laois County Council assists families to return to their hometowns, if safe to do so, with the aid of a deposit for private rented accommodation and rent supplement with the Health Services Executive. Laois County Council also have available two transitional units in the County for victims of domestic violence where it is deemed safe for them to remain in the County.
